A PV solar power array that is known to meet National Electrical Code standards will be waterproof and can be safely cleaned with a waterfed pole. - A scratched coating is one thing, and scratched glass is another. - Ammonia and water will work also, however doing 60 panels that size, odor will become an issue for the workers. Rain blade and oil flow work is my choice. - The water was at 150 TDS on the way in and 1 TDS on the way out, but the water did NOT seem to stain like it has on other jobs. So, there were tiny, dirty water spots after the glass had been cleaned them three times. wonder if this is going to affect how we use Acid Alts? Will we have to follow ANSI/SIA A92.1 standard ANSI/IWCA I-14? - We carry a bath towel in our belt and wipe up any water spills on the frames, then wash the mudd of the cleaning equipment that is in the air of the job.
